

Dear Sophomores,

This is an exciting academic year for you. All of you will decide on a major by the spring. Some of you will study abroad this fall or spring.

I'd like to share some information with you about the Rome study abroad offering. Your class will be the last to take part in the Saint Mary's Rome Program that started 45 years ago. Beginning next summer and in time for the 2016-17 academic year, the College, pending contract approval, will partner with John Cabot University for Rome study abroad. The new program offers many options, including the possibility to study in Rome as a junior or senior.

The pending partnership with John Cabot University includes:

- A rich intercultural experience. Saint Mary's prepares students to be global citizens. Students will benefit from the diverse student population at John Cabot. More than 1,000 students from up to 70 other countries attend the university.
- An expanded curriculum. The university offers a wide array of general education courses and higher-level courses in some majors. Depending on the major, more students could study in Rome, even as juniors and seniors, without falling behind.
- **More options.** Students may consider a summer session, which we do not currently offer.
- **Off-campus opportunities.** John Cabot offers students internships and service opportunities in the Italian community.
- **Affordability.** Students currently pay a surcharge of \$2,500 a semester to participate in the College's Rome program. If the partnership with John Cabot is affirmed, as expected, there will not be a surcharge added on to tuition for at least the next three years. (Summer study abroad opportunities are not included in tuition, so there is a cost to attend in the summer.)

For this academic year (2015-16), the program continues as it has for all these years, with Dr. Prebys leading it. It's not too late to sign up to take part in the existing program in the spring of 2016.
